An inside • • ...into our 2/3 Classroom


Students in the 2/3 class enjoyed working with their buddies in the K/1 class to create Valentine's Day cards for the seniors in our community.

4/5 Lillian Schillemore – I would give the gift of everyone being able to go to school, because girls are not allowed to go to school in some countries.






6/7 Peyton Boer – I would give a stuffed animal to everyone, so that if anyone is sad they will have something to hold or cry into.
