# From the Principal's Desk

This year in chapel, we are focusing on the Core Competencies. The BC Curriculum states that Core Competencies are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need in order to engage in deep, lifelong learning. Along with literacy and numeracy foundations, they are central to British Columbia's K-12 curriculum and directly support students in their growth as educated citizens.

At Agassiz Christian school, however, we go further. We view the Core Competencies as gifts from God – gifts that we are given and that God asks us to develop throughout our whole life.



Students and staff develop Core Competencies when they are engaged in the "doing" within a variety of learning activities, whether in the classroom or on the playground.

Students at Agassiz Christian encounter opportunities to develop their competence in formal and informal settings. and are reminded often that God is shaping and molding them for His purposes. The Core Competencies align with our goal of continually finding ways for students to "Discover, Grow, and Thrive." As together we engage with the curriculum, students are continually discovering new insights and growing as people. They are also thriving, as they develop their core competencies in all areas of their life.

This month in chapel, we focused on the core competency of Communication. We looked at the life of Moses. God called Moses to lead his people, even though Moses thought he was a very poor speaker. Students were challenged to continually find ways to develop their communication skills, always being ready to use those skills to honour God.

Paul Barnewell, a high school teacher, states that,

"Conversational competence might be the single most overlooked skill we fail to teach. Kids spend hours each day engaging with ideas and each other through screens, but rarely do they have an opportunity to hone their interpersonal communications skills. It might sound like a funny question, but we have to ask ourselves: Is there any 21st Century skill more important than being able to sustain coherent. confident conversation?"

The gift of communication is a pretty cool gift. So, in school and out, and as staff and students, we will continue to celebrate and develop God's gift of Communication. •
