The Grade 2/3's are the most inquisitive and creative bunch. Most weeks they come to school one morning to find a STEM bin of supplies on their desk. Their task is to create something out of the random supplies given. It might be a box of cubes, paper cups, play-doh and toothpicks, paper and tape, or pipe cleaners and straws. The possibilities are endless and so are their imaginations.





They have created castles and pattern chains. domino towers, animals, robots and wild creatures, spelt their name in cursive, served up imaginary cake and made cars out of magnet tiles. We love seeing how each student creates something unique and stretches their thinking to think outside the box. STEM bins help us to practice creative and critical thinking, exercise patience, reinforce our collaboration skills and remind us that ideas don't always come together the first time and sometimes the best ideas happen out of an idea gone awry.





In Grade 2/3, one of our Theme topics has been Community. What does it mean to be part of a community? What communities are we a part of? How do communities function? Do they all work the same? We love to recite all the layers of community from belonging to the universe, the Milky Way galaxy, planet Earth, North America. Canada and all the way down to Agassiz, our school, and our families.





As we have discussed what it means to belong to a community, we paused to focus specifically on our town of Agassiz and how a town works. And what better way to tie it all together than to walk to the Municipal Hall and have a visit with Mayor Pranger. Mayor Pranger graciously allowed us to explore council chambers, sit in all the chairs, practice speaking into microphones, tour the whole building, meet each department, and, most importantly, answered our many, many questions.
