Matthew 22:37-39 says, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment." The second is like it: "Love your neighbour as yourself."

I recently toured a prospective family through the school, and we talked about our Biblical perspective. They assumed that we had a chapel every week, and that our Christian instruction stopped there. I assured them that God calls us to so much more than one chapel per week, and that our Christian faith and worldview was tied into everything that we do and into all that we are.

We can't just talk about Pink Shirt Day on February 26. We talk about it all year, because God calls us to. He calls us to "love our neighbours as ourselves" every day and in a multitude of ways. And so, I went to the experts - our students - to find out their perspectives about loving your neighbour. Here are some of their responses.

This year has brought many exciting changes to our Preschool! Not only have the children been getting acquainted with two new teachers this year, but we've also had the pleasure of playing and creating in our new classroom portable. Preschool is about new beginnings, new friends, new challenges and new ideas. So far this year in preschool, the children have been doing an amazing job of learning and growing. Their wide-eyed curiosity and genuine interest in learning about the world and people around them brings excitement into the classroom every day.

Each day, the class focuses on memorizing their ABC's and 1,2,3's, learning social skills, navigating new scenarios, and managing feelings both big and small. They spend time playing together, while learning how to include each other and incorporate different ideas. Engaging in play at the house centre, with Lego, building with blocks, doing puzzles or racing toy cars is just pure fun, but also a critical part of early childhood development.



A day in our class consists of circle time, learning about the months and days of the week, letter recognition, playtime, arts and crafts, fine motor skills, socializing, and outdoor play. Letter recognition includes learning about a new letter of the alphabet, along with the sound it makes and how to write it. Some children are even getting quite good at writing their own names! Lately, we have been working on letters M, N, O, P. The children had fun making hand print monkeys for the letter M, octopus and ostriches for O, and learning about penguins for the letter P.

During our Penguins unit, the children were introduced to many of the different kinds of penguins; from the large Emperor Penguin to the tiny Little Blue Penguin, as well as where they live, what they eat, and how they walk. The kids had a blast trying to mimic the "daddy penguin waddle" when trying to walk across the classroom with a pretend penguin egg on their feet. They even attempted to pass the "egg" to a partner, all without letting the egg touch the "frozen ground."

Along with learning letters, numbers, shapes and colours, each month the class learns several different Bible stories. "Jesus Walks on Water" and "Jesus Feeds the 5,000" are examples of the Bible readings we have done, which encourage the children to have faith and trust in God even when things seem difficult or impossible. We also made crafts based on "Jonah and the Whale," and "Noah's Ark," which taught that listening to God's Word is important. It is such a joy watching these young children grow and learn so much, in such a short amount of time. We look forward to continuing the year learning about how to show love and kindness to others, as well as learning more about the beauty God has created!
